Teacher Training Workshop

In January, we organized a workshop for the staff and teachers from our projects in Siem Reap and Kampong Speu. Our Ruby School team hosted the weekend event which was attended by 15 rural educators. The teachers from Siem Reap prepared presentations on their curriculums and best practices. Everyone was able to exchange information and ideas through group discussions and question/ answer periods. We also learned about each other's background and why he or she chose to become a teacher. It was an inspiring time together. We closed with a special dinner to honor our faithful and hard working teachers.

Parent Teacher Seminar—Siem Reap

In March, we hosted our first ever Parent-Teacher seminar for the families of children enrolled in our free education programs. Parents are not normally included or invited to participate in their children's education here, so we weren't sure how it would go. But the response was so enthusiastic! 120 parents attended! Parents were able to meet the staff and learn about our teaching methods for both English and IT. We were delighted to meet one woman who



had graduated from our courses herself, when she was in primary school. She's now a mother whose children are benefitting from these programs! Our English classes feature the acclaimed Brillkids software. Thanks to the Early Education for Every Child Foundation (EEECF), we received 120 new licenses to update our classrooms & IT labs!





Connecting with a Community Orphanage

With a little budget left from our Christmas programs, a generous donation of chips, and boxes of 2nd hand clothing donated by our teaching staff, we visited a local orphanage about an hour's drive from our Ruby School. There we spent the afternoon with the 70 resident children, sharing the Creation story on our big flannelgraph board, and organizing outdoor games and activities. Each child received a small gift, plus a folder of new school supplies. The director has visited us since, inviting us back any time to share classes, training or activities with the children and staff.










Honoring our Elders


Return to Koh Kong-as Promised!
