Training Teachers—Guiding and Protecting our Children



Each week we conduct trainings for our teachers at Ruby School, in Kampong Speu. Besides sharing helpful teaching tips we also focus on the qualities of a good teacher. Our staff are more than just English or Preschool teachers. They play a crucial role in guiding & protecting our 150 students. We covered topics like controlling our moods, being role models in our behavior, the power of gratitude, giving each class our very best, providing order & a sense of safety to our students. In June, the local news and social media were buzzing with reports of strangers on motorbikes accosting children, or offering candy to get a child to follow them. We did a series of trainings on how to teach kids personal safety rules into Khmer and gave all teachers a copy to review with their classes, on how to be

wise and look out for each other. "Be not overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." Romans 12:21







A Brighter Future

It is so rewarding to see the bright faces of the students in our free education programs in Siem Reap. The children choose to join our English and IT classes, instead of taking extra tuition in other subjects. They are eager to improve their lives and really make the most of the opportunity to develop computer skills and learn to read, write and speak English. We began this program 17 years ago, teaching English to a handful of kids during the lunch break, which was the only time when a classroom was available. Now we are fully set up in 2 different public primary schools with our own classrooms for all day lessons in English; and IT labs for all day computer training. A total of 340 children, grades 4 to 6, are doing their best to realize a brighter future for themselves and their families. "Education is the movement from darkness to light"—Allan Bloom
