### New Children's Safe Home

For over 12 years, we partnered with CCPCR (a local charity) to help in the recovery & restoration of more than 2000 trafficked and abused children. Due to a shift in global donor priorities, plus housing challenges, the project had to close a few years ago. Yet, the need for safe homes for vulnerable kids continued to rise, especially post pandemic. And we always dreamed to re-start the shelter in a more secure location.

Then our dear friend & sponsor of many years, Mr. Bernard, decided to launch a fundraiser with the Singapore YPO's, to open a new Children's safe house. The response was phenomenal! By the end of January, 5 years worth of building and operations budget was secured and construction began in February. Wow!

We're partnering again with Mr.Thy, the director of CCPCR. He now owns a farm about 40 minutes from us & kindly offered one hectare of his land



to build the shelter on. The rest of the land has 700 fruit trees, 2 ponds for raising fish. The Shelter will have the capacity to eventually care for up to 40 resident children.



## Equipment Upgrade for Siem Reap

Thanks to the generosity of our sponsors, we were able to upgrade our classrooms in Siem Reap with 2 new study tables for the English classrooms, 5 new PC's (computer/ monitors) for the IT Labs & 2 new large screen TV's! On behalf of the 375 students who benefit daily from our free education programs, we are truly grateful!!
