Central Vietnam (Da Nang, Quang Tri and Hue)

Two different years big typhoon storms hit Central Vietnam. Trees and houses submersed in water. Many people lost their houses. Especially in the city Quang Tri, Gioi Linh, and An Tho. The people of the area are particularly poor because of the yearly storms and the war that raged took Central Vietnam. The people of this area were very thin as most of their top soil was washed away making it difficult to grow vegetables and rice. Recently the government has been trying to improve this. Our group of volunteer workers solicited help from our friends and donors, in this particular storm gave 3 tons of rice to the people of Quang Tri and the other small towns mentioned above. We also gave a substantial monetary donations for the people in the commune of which there were hundreds of people. Many university teachers helped us to deliver the food to the storm worn people. In these storms many people were trapped on small islands surrounded by water or on the top of their house. Often their clothes would fall off of them from being wet for a long period of time. They would receive food from row boats to keep them alive.



Besides, telling of Salvation, Jesus also had a lot to say about helping the poor "Sell all that you have and give to the poor." We have found that you cannot effectively preach Salvation without helping people with their physical needs. Also in Mathew 25:35-40 "For I was hungry and you gave Me food. I was thirsty and you gave Me drink. I was a stranger and you took Me in. Naked and you clothed Me ...". And He said, "In as much as you have done it to one of the least of these, My brethren, you've done it to Me." There is a blessing to those who consider the poor. -Psalm 31:1,2. Even in old times, Levi 19:33,34 "They spoke of the stranger in the gate who you were to feed and care for." The good Samaritan whom Jesus commended and used as an example of loving your neighbor as yourself is second in importance only to loving the Lord with all your heart, soul and mind, the first commandment. -Mathew 22: 37-40.

We work with anyone who loves the Lord (we can not say "I am of Paul. I am of Apollo or Cephas. Are we not all of Christ?") We feel we must all work together. It's too big a job for anyone individual church or denomination.

"Little Eyes" is the name of our charity work here in Vietnam since 2009 and this is the way we operate here. (See page 7 for explanation)

For the last 48 years, starting in Ohio, in the US and in Canada and including here in Vietnam, I and we here in Vietnam have lived by faith, trusting the Lord to supply all our needs. As we seek first Him and His Kingdom and the lost. He has never failed us. We've never missed one meal because of His lack of supply. So since He said "Ask and you shall receive"." We invest particularly in Vietnam's children and youth of today to help build the leaders of tomorrow. We accomplish this purpose through the following projects & activities:

 Provide wholesome educational character building reading and audio visual materials free of charge for abandoned and underprivileged children. We also provide them with love, moral support, character building training and educational opportunities.

Provide English language classes for underprivileged youth.

Translate educational and motivational literature, audio & visual materials.

 Channel donated goods, supplies to poor and socially disadvantaged people including orphaned and disadvantaged children as much as possible especially the very needy who have no other help available.

Our current projects are:

"Education Programs: with a few minor changes we have received government permission and are donating Grandpa Jake bilingual storybooks, in Vietnamese and English languages, providing these character building books for orphanage and poor children in the various orphanages and poor schools in South Central and North Vietnam where the books are donated free of charge to the children. We are translating several other character building children's books and audio visual materials into Vietnamese. The government recognizes the need for good character building books for children in Vietnam, so they are flexible as long as it doesn't come across with strong preaching.

Other programs: many orphanages in the city have enough food and basic needs. When we see one that does not have these needs, we endeavor to help them to obtain their needs. Like this orphanage, we helped to purchase many food items and cleaning equipment, for a couple of months to help them get started as this ex nun does the fund raising herself with a few colleagues.

This month, with Easter coming we are getting 1,000 children's step books printed to send up to the mountains to the sweet ethnic people through our mission minded Vietnamese friends. Soon we will be taking an Activated allegorical story about "the Lion, the Dragon, and the Beast" 3 End time characters. Please keep all of this in your prayers.

We also have been teaching the Bible at a drug rehabilitation center, where 12 young men have had great deliverance from drugs such as heroine and are now dedicated to Jesus and they also witness Salvation to the Vietnamese people, much like the hippy generation that we knew from the sixty's. And there are also several centers like this one in North Vietnam. We have helped by teaching Bible. They also work with other churches who have helped them over come heroine. God bless these churches in the North .They have 100's of converted men and women in Hanoi and now in the south Saigon!

We are also working with a church that works mainly with Ethnic people similar to American Indians. Wonderful people! Very intelligent We want to distribute literature about Jesus to them. We gave them 1000 copies of about "The rise of the Anti Christ."

At the orphanage we visited 58 orphans 28 of them are new born babies that had been abandoned by their mother at birth. These new born babies were found in the graveyards. on door steps, and many in plastic bags and in garbage dumps! And some of them covered with numerous ant bites on their face and body and the people who found them were able to save their lives by taking them to the hospital. And after some time they were totally revived. We will help these children (by supplying food and clothing and other necessary items.) This visit we gave the older school age kids 90 bilingual Grandpa Jake books for their older children. We also had met several other visitors from other places that received the Lord with us. We will try to visit the orphans bi weekly and help them to raise their standard of living.
